22. A. Investigation: THE JATO BOTTLES WERE FIRED IMMEDIATELY FOLLOWING THE LAPES DROP, WITH THE CARGO RAMP STILL OPEN. THE HEAT AND BLAST OF THE JATO BOTTLES BURNED THE FITTINGS FOR THE RAMP ACTUATING JACK ATTACHMENT POINTS AND BURNED THROUGH THE RAMP SKIN AT THE "ELEPHANT EARS". THESE ARE MULTIPLE LAYERED FAIRINGS ENCLOSING THE RAMP CLOSING FITTINGS.
